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This Year's Every Member In Ministry Campaign

Our Ministry Stewards are enthusiastically preparing for this year's campaign. The core of the program remains unchanged—all people who attend our church are asked to support the church with their prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness.

"Service" will be the first of the five commitments we will highlight beginning Sunday August 29. "Gifts" will be highlighted in early November. "Prayers", "Presence", and "Witness" will each be examined in depth as we move into 2011.

Our mission statement is: "To equip generations to become spiritually maturing Christians." That cannot be achieved by a pastor, or a leadership team, or a church council. It can and is being achieved by the people joining together to care about their God, their church and each other.

We were convinced four years ago when we first learned about Every Member in Ministry that it is a concept that makes the most sense as a way to strengthen and grow our church. We are equally convinced today, after applying the Every Member in Ministry model for the past four years, it is a great way to "do church." When each person in the church agrees to take responsibility for one or more needs in the church, we become unified in our mission and our results.

Here is the agenda for the next couple of months:

- Sun. Aug 29—sermon that focuses on people of our church who reach out to others in service. Ministry Commitment Catalogs and sign-up forms will be distributed.
- Sun. Aug 29, 5 p.m.—New Member Welcome—people who have joined in the past year and their First Friends will attend a brief welcome in the Chapel before moving to Becker Hall to join members of the church in a welcome potluck at 5:30 p.m. Ministry representatives will be available in Becker Hall to answer questions for new members.
- Sun. September 5—Labor Day weekend—one special service for the church at 10 a.m., the same as we did on the July 4. We have tentatively planned for a cookout and potluck following the service.
- Sun. September 12—Laity Sunday—the worship service will be presented by lay members of our church and will focus on their sharing their individual commitments to service. We will collect Ministry sign-up forms to begin January 2011.

EDUCATION

The Spring WOW Wednesday Program went well only as far as the quality of the subject material and the enthusiasm of the instructors. We had very limited participation with the exception of the "Scrap-booking" class. Some of the classes had only one to two students. The lack of enthusiasm was a surprise since each Wednesday during the eight-week period was highlighted with a terrific meal presented by Jan Lowe and her friends.

We intend to continue to offer "Special" education opportunities, maybe not on Wednesday, and maybe not for an eight-week term. We are planning for a suitable period on suitable days offering a variety of courses that should include subjects of interest to most of our congregation. The programs will be starting in mid-September 2010. The September Newsletter will lay out the program details.

If you have a subject that you would like to know more about or that you would like to teach, write a note to the office headed "Attention Education." Your desires will be seriously considered. Any subject will be considered from Bible study to fly-tying.

Give this serious thought; let's make the Church the center of our lives.

DISCIPLE BIBLE STUDY

It's that time of year again. Disciple Bible Study groups are forming and plans are being made to invite new participants to the program. Disciple Bible Study is an opportunity to begin, or renew, your study of our Christian scripture. It is a series of the sequential study of the Bible and begins with an overview of the Old and New Testaments and ends with a study of Revelation. This study takes four years to complete but leaves you with a new and exciting understanding of what the Holy Scripture holds for you as an individual.

For the 2010-2011 year, there are two opportunities for you to take part. A Disciple 1 class will meet on Wednesday mornings from 9:00 to 11:30. This class is the foundation for all of the other Disciple classes; it provides each learner with a sound knowledge of the Old and New Testaments – the basis for the other three studies. This class must be taken before you can enroll in any of the other Disciple classes.

The second opportunity for study is for those who have completed Disciple 1 and would like to continue their studies. A Disciple 2 class will be offered on Friday mornings from 9:00 to 11:30. Disciple 2 is a sixteen-week study of Genesis and Exodus – these books are the foundation of the Hebrew faith, and a sixteen-week study of Luke and Acts – the foundation of our Christian faith.

Toward the end of August, there will be informational meetings for each of these classes. Watch the church bulletin or contact Alan Packard – 855-1168 for more specific information.

There will also be other opportunities for Disciple Bible study this year on a shorter basis. For those of you who do not want to commit to 32 or 34 weeks at a time, we will offer sixteen- or seventeen-week sessions from November to March. Disciple 1 and 2 would seem to be the logical offerings for these studies, but Disciple 3 is also a possibility. These classes would be offered on Monday or Tuesday. If this sounds interesting, contact Alan Packard at 855-1168.

Other opportunities are available if there is enough interest. Evening class are always available – the only requirement is that we need to secure a group of at least six people to participate.



VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

Bible School was a great success for 42 children, many of them our own First United Methodist children.




