
## BOOK DISCUSSION

## ACTS: A GUIDE TO PRAYER



Do you ever have a problem when you feel a strong desire to speak with Father God, but somehow, when you try to begin you find only a jumble of thoughts are flying through your mind?

The following guide may help you organize your thoughts that you may better express yourself. God hears and understands regardless of how poorly we feel we've done (actually He knows the desires of our hearts, and understands them better than we do) but *you* need to pray in a way that leaves you refreshed, calm and blessed.

Assume a comfortable posture in a quiet place, take several deep, cleansing breaths, and wait quietly until your body, mind and spirit are still and then begin by addressing God, prepared to give Him all your mind's attention and your heart's affection.

There are many ways to stay focused, the following anagram – ACTS, is only one; it spells out the sequence and function of each phase of your prayer and it's biblical basis.

**ADORATION:** To worship and acknowledge the majesty of God. "*Great is the Lord, and most worthy of praise.*"

~ Psalm 48:1

**CONFESSION:** Go directly to God to acknowledge your sins and seek His forgiveness. "*If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us.*"

~ 1 John 1:9

**THANKSGIVING:** Acknowledge the abundant blessings of God. "*Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His love endures forever.*"

~ 1 Chronicles 16:34

**SUPPLICATION:** To present our requests to God, trusting in His will with obedience. "*Trust in the Lord. . .and He will direct your paths.*"

~ Proverbs 3:5-6

Remember, this is merely a guide. Always follow the leading of the Holy Spirit within.
