Technology is an amazing thing. Almost any type of program is available on our television sets with just the click of a button. You can even find our 8:00 a.m. worship service broadcast on the Bella Vista Channel (Cox channel 222) every Sunday morning at 10:00 a.m.



None of this would be possible without the dedication of our video technicians. Bob Toney has been the mainstay of this ministry for many years. Thanks to Bob's dedication, our 8:00 a.m. service has been video taped and taken to Bella Vista television station every Sunday morning. Members of not only our congregation, but others in our community, have been able to share in our worship services.

As technology has advanced, so has our ability to share our worship services in other ways. Our Director of Media Ministries, Eric Troy Jorgensen, has shared his skills and you can now find our worship services, Lenten services and other special programs on our YouTube Channel (<http://www.youtube.com/user/FUMCBV>). You can even "friend" us on Facebook (First United Methodist Church of Bella Vista.)

As of April 17, our Traditional Worship service is broadcast live online every Sunday morning at 8:00 a.m. The video broadcast, referred to as a "Live Stream", is viewable world-wide directly on our website, www.LoveLearnLead.com. Broadcasting live online is 100% free since the video streaming service we're using is supported by occasional advertisements. As we experiment with this feature, we hope to provide a live video stream of the Contemporary and additional Traditional Worship services in the near future.


This is truly an example of how new technological advances provide a means for us to reach out globally to "equip generations to become spiritually maturing Christians."


As orders are turned in and funds collected, you'll begin to see the cases of canned goods and staples build the "mountain of food" outside of Becker Hall.
